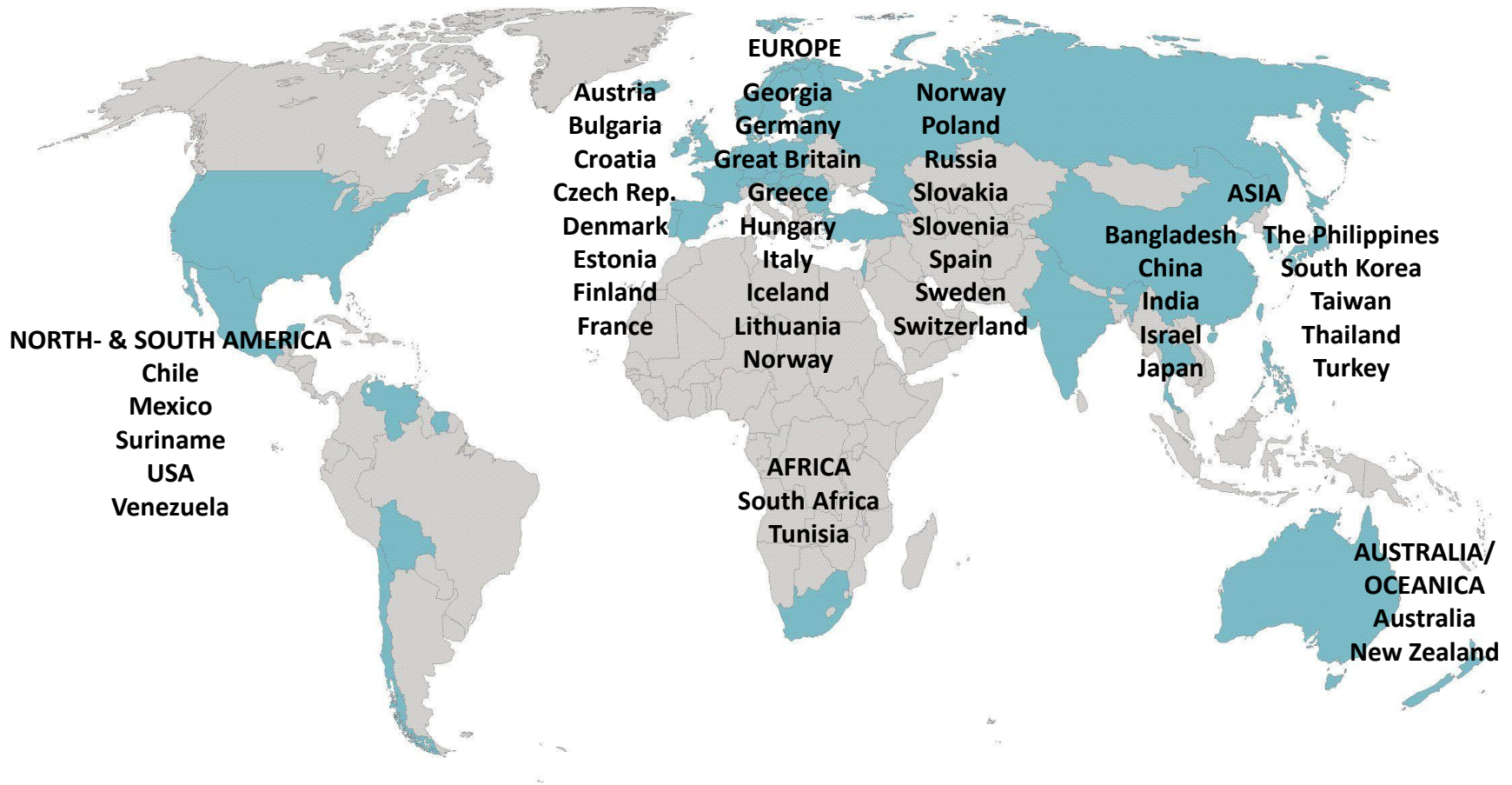

# Basic Information

- Collaborative cross-national programme
- Founded in 1984 by four countries:  
Australia, Germany, Great Britain, USA
- Developed out of cooperation of general social surveys
- 60 items, not longer than 15 minutes
- Annual surveys, topics important for social sciences
- Three GESIS departments involved

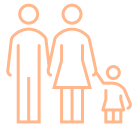
- No central funding

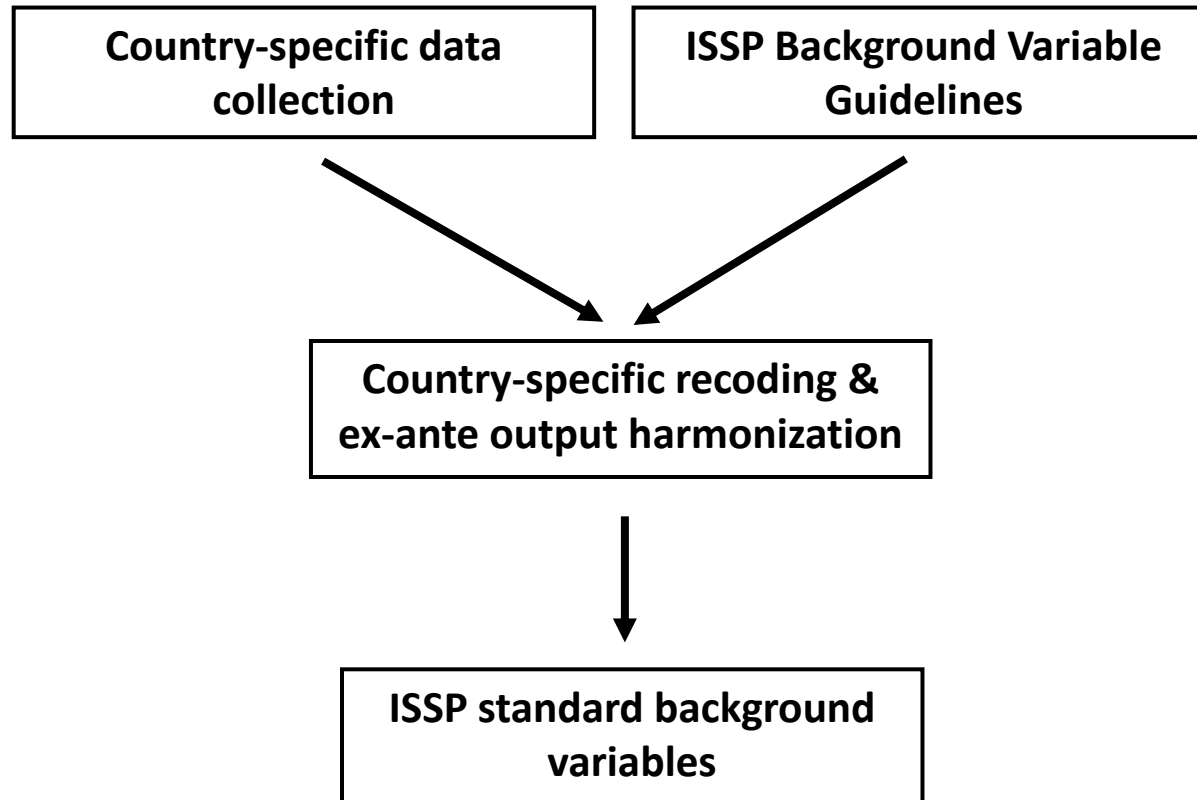

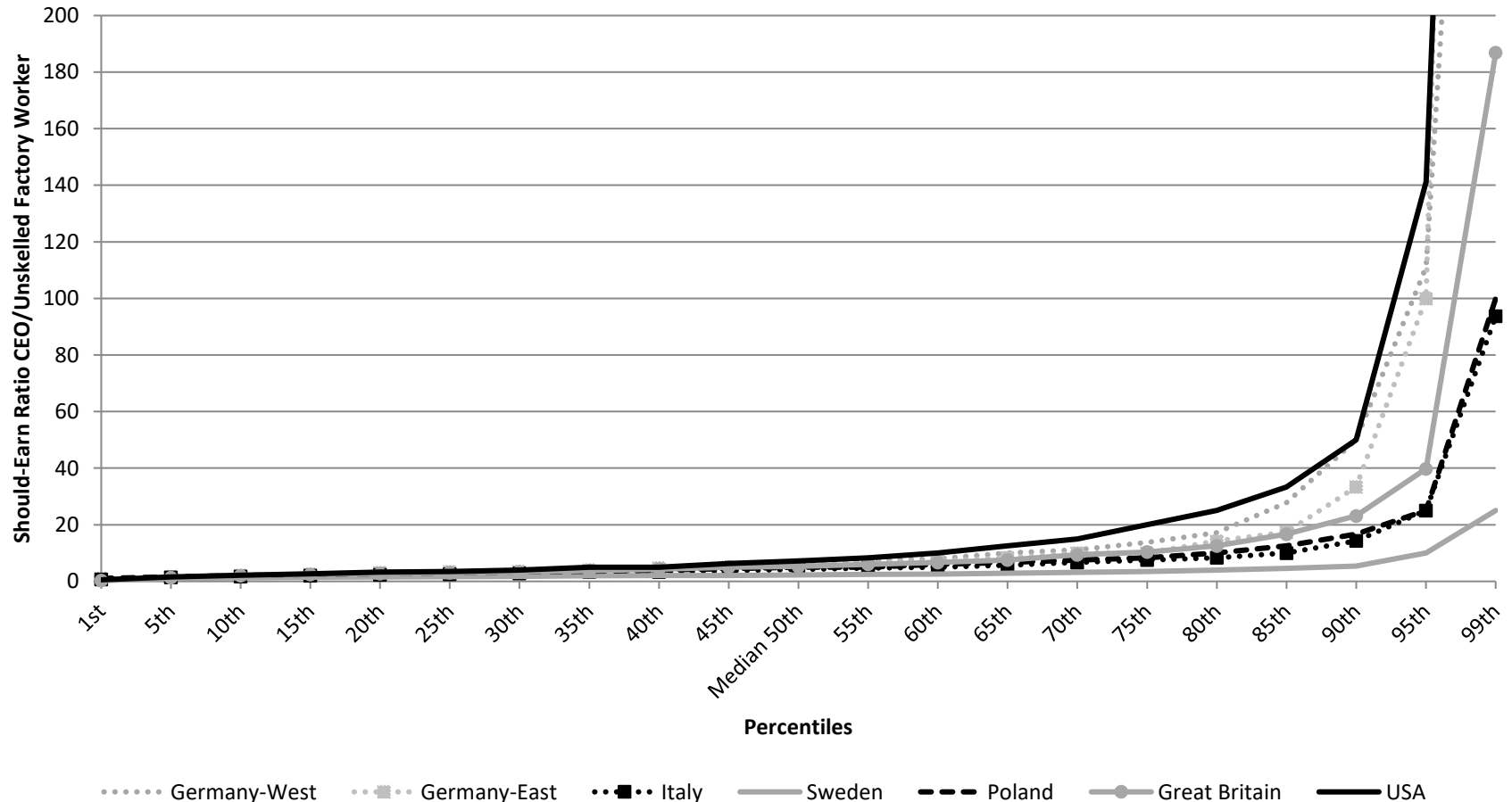

# Fundamental Research

- Module topic: Religion
  - ▶ Concept: Religiosity
  - ▶ Dimensions: Cognitive, Affective, Behavioral
  - ▶ 7 items covering the dimensions
  - ▶ Check which religious types are revealed in the data by Latent Class Analysis

# LCA Results – Believe in God

	Type 1	Type 2	Type 3	Type 4
<b>Cluster Size</b>	0.25	0.30	0.27	0.18
I don't believe in God	0.67	0.04	0.00	0.01
Don't know whether there is a God, no way to find out	0.22	0.21	0.01	0.00
Don't believe in a personal God, but in a Higher Power	0.09	0.41	0.13	0.02
I find myself believing in God sometimes	0.02	0.19	0.11	0.00
While I have doubts, I feel that I do believe in God	0.01	0.12	0.43	0.07

# Role of Government

The ISSP Role of Government module series comprises four surveys conducted in [1985](#), [1990](#), [1996](#), [2006](#) and [2016](#). Successive surveys are always partial replications of earlier surveys.

ISSP Role of Government modules mainly deal with issues, such as attitudes towards government responsibilities and government spending, state intervention in the economy, civil liberties, political interest, trust and efficacy.

Please, note that ISSP Role of Government data (so far modules I-IV) is also available as a [cumulated data file](#), allowing for cross-national analyses over time.


